## Easy-bake lovin'

Park Slope's café and prepared-food haven **Get Fresh Table and Market** (370 Fifth Ave between 5th and 6th Sts; 718-360-8469) offers a novel biscuit that even an old-schooler like Cookie Monster would love: rosemary-lime, a tender confection with wintergreen notes and a pleasing acidity. The cookies are baked to order (\$1.75 for one), which means you need to wait approximately 11 minutes (an eternity in cookie time) for yours. It also means always getting a warm one, which seems to arrive on its own cloud of toasty aroma (actually, a waitress brings it). The second-best part: You can take home a log of ready-to-bake dough (\$11) and keep it in the fridge for emergencies—snack on it raw when you're jonesing, or slice and bake when you feel the urge (or, dare we say, share it with guests). The dough does well with a few extra minutes in the oven, the edges caramelized but the center still soft and chewy. Made with organic flour, local Hudson Valley Fresh milk and cage-free eggs from the Lancaster Farm Fresh Cooperative, these are positively PC, and definitely Sesame Street-friendly. But if you're a glutton like Cookie, those nuances might be beside the point.—Tejal Rao
